## **Human Trafficking Notices**

On New Years Eve, Caring Palms received a call fromWJXT-TV asking if we were aware of the new law that was going in effect thenext day. Our response, like 40 othersthat were called before us was, "no." Thiswas a surprise as we had not received any communication from the stategovernment.

The new law (as we were informed by WJXT) was that all "massage parlors" needed to have signs notifying people about HumanTrafficking. First of all, we reactedpoorly to the term massage parlor (see other article), but this sent us doingmassive research the first couple of days of the new year. What we found out surprised us, and we are passing it on to you, so you have an understanding as well.

First off, human trafficking is not a joke, and the mostcommon places that it is happening (nationwide) are adult entertainmentbusinesses and massage therapy businesses (angling to those that are performingillegal acts, truly your massage parlors). Human trafficking is where people are being treated

as property. These are people that owe money, or who havebeen taken against their will. Thedemands that these types of establishments have certain signs alerting people of the possibility, and to look for anything that does not look right.

But the law also excludes massage establishments that areowned by health care professionals as these professionals spent a lot of timeon education to get their licenses, and know the difference between healthcareand something else. Healthcareprofessionals are defined by Florida Statute 456 as anyone licensed undercertain sections of Florida law. Theseinclude massage therapists, doctors or any kind of medical practitioner, acupuncturists, chiropractors, physical therapists, and a host of other statelicensed practitioners.

Basically, businesses like Caring Palms does not need topost this signage because it is owned by a licensed massage therapist. However, since most of the corporate chainmassage businesses are not owned by healthcare professionals, they must have these signs.

Unlike what the TV news stations believe, there is a difference between legitimate massage businesses and "massage parlors", and that difference is a business that is focused on healthcare, like Caring Palms.

## **Definitions and Terminology**

Definitions. Weseem to be fighting wars of definitions and terminology. Nowhere is that more true than the massage industry where commonly used terms are passed down through the years that no longer have bearing.

For instance, let's start with one of the basics, MassageParlor. Now, this term has been aroundforever. Back in the late 1800s, whensomeone graduated from a school of massage, they opened a massage parlor. In those days, parlor was an innocent wordused to describe a lot of things. In olderterms it was used as part of a name with such businesses like Beauty Parlors, or Funeral Parlors. One definitiondescribed it as a somewhat private room in a hotel, club, or the like for relaxation, conversation, etc. And at that time, Massage Parlor was right inline with those definitions. However, times have changed.

Since the first massage legislationcame about in 1934 (here in Florida), there have been certain requirements formassage therapists and Massage Establishments (yes, that is the properterm). It set a standard for legalbusinesses doing massage therapy. Andtherapists would prefer that terminology over the older term.

The term parlor has taken on a sexual connotation in the past 50 years or so (something that does not happen in legalmassage establishments). In fact, whenyou look online you find these types of definitions...

from Wikipedia

A massage parloris the term commonly used as a euphemism for a brothel, an establishment thatis actually a front for prostitution. However, not all massage parlors are brothels.

from the Urban Dictionary

A place where you get a massage but most commonly refersto a whore house in disguise of a legitimate massage business.

When these are the common definitions of the term parlor,legitimate therapists prefer the use of some other term, like establishment, orbusiness, or studio (our preference). Ithurts when reports by TV news

(like the one recently by WJXT, and most of the Florida TV stations that reported on this) refer to massagebusinesses as massage parlors. And everyreference like this hurts and lowers the perceptions of our business when we gothrough so much to make people understand the type of work we do and the greatneed for it. After all, we are not places for elicit sexual activity. We are a place of healing. Most of the people we see are in pain. They have pulled muscles, soreness, injuries. We help these people get back to normal function by relieving pain. We also help people relax form the stressful world out there. This is healthcare.

It is time to educate those that do not understand the difference.

Another term that is commonly misused is masseuse. Back when Per Henrik Ling created themovements of Swedish massage, and then someone else gave those movements Frenchnames, the French terms for massage therapists came about... masseuse andmasseur. Masseuse (which is the mostcommon term and used to describe anyone that does massage) is a femaletherapist and masseur is a male therapist. Again, old terms that no longer apply. The correct term now is Massage Therapist which has the advantage ofbeing non-sexual.

So, education is the key. Those of you that know, please spread the word. Maybe we can educate the people so they nolonger look down on this profession.

While it does go over some basics, it takes body mechanics to a newlevel where every move involves the use of the therapist's entire body so they can work without hurting themselves. The class being part lecture, parthands-on practice takes positions, centering, and the proper use of bodystrength from Japanese martial arts and applies them to the art of massagetherapy. It also shows how to focus one's energies to increase their strengthwith simple exercises meant to teach the student how to 'think' beyond wherethey are working so they can get deeper into the client and to channel theirenergies to the point of thought. The student will learn how to focus theirenergies and use their body to do deep work and not get hurt. This class willhelp anyone to work deeply with less effort no matter if one is 90 pounds or 250 pounds. This class is for both the seasoned therapist and the newtherapist. It will show moves everyone does, but in a new light as well asmoves many people may not have seen before. The idea is not to dictate how topractice, but to show better body mechanics which the therapist can adapt towhat they do. This is true whether they adapt all of it or just part of it.

# Modality of the Month Hot Stone Massage

Hot Stone massage is a unique style where heated rocks are moved over the body allowing the heat to sink into the muscles. Although deep work is not usually done with Hot Stone, the heat penetrates to make the muscles relax and feel better.

There are several types of Hot Stone massage and like other massage styles, these change with each therapist that does the work. Probably the most known style is called La Stone which was based on the types of massage done by native American Indians. They used hot and cold stones to create a relaxing experience. Marie Hannigan took this information and created La Stone from it as she was hurting her hands doing a lot of deep tissue work. With the stone, it gave her a tool to go deeply with while the heat penetrated and softened the muscles.
